LENT is an important season in the Church's liturgical year. It is a 40-day period of fasting, abstinence and repentance that begins on Ash Wednesday. No meat is eaten on Ash Wednesday, Fridays during Lent, and Good Friday. The season culminates with the liturgies of Holy Week, which recall the passion and death of Jesus Christ. Purple is used for vestments and altar cloths during Lent. At Mass, the Gloria is omitted and the word "alleluia" is not said or sung.
