About the Cover – Pictured on the bulletin cover is the Holy Family, from a stained glass window in St. Patrick Church. The window depicts the Holy Family of Nazareth; the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, and Jesus as a young boy. The family is going about their tasks of daily life. Mary is working with a distaff and spindle, calling to mind the ideal wife described in Proverbs 31:19. Joseph, the carpenter, is at work providing for his family. Jesus, the obedient Son, is assisting. The three figures are of one accord and are much attuned to each other. However, the child Jesus, also seems to be listening to another – his heavenly Father's voice. He is the one who asked of his parents "Why did you search for me? Did you not know I must be about my Father's business?" Despite the harmony, there is a foreshadowing of Jesus' destiny as our crucified Savior. The blood red cloth and the cross like lumber carried by the young boy are indicators of the man he will become that laid down His life for us. In 1937, former pastor, Fr. William P. Clark wrote a book entitled, "Brief History of St. Patrick's Parish." He wrote that the window, a gift of the Dwyer Brothers costing \$180, was added at the time of the addition to the church in 1910-11. Over the course of time as an outgrowth of our 150th anniversary year, we hope to feature other artistic and devotional works within the church that give us a foretaste of heaven.



"The crowds preceding Him and those following kept crying out and saying: 'Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!' THE EASTER TRIDUUM

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum – from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are:

- Mass of the Lord's Supper
- Good Friday of the Lord's Passion
- Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord

THE ATTITUDE OF CHRIST JESUS

The Lenten cycle brings us to this "mixed" Sunday of palm branches and painful suffering. Our liturgy opens by recalling Jesus' triumphant entry along the main road into Jerusalem, then moves quickly to the back streets of betrayal and humiliation, the courtyards of torture and abandonment, the hill of execution.

Isaiah's strange and gripping "Song of the Servant of God" was to become the song of Jesus. It is the song of one who strides forward consistently in the face of criticism, even scorn: "I have not rebelled, have not turned back." It is to become our song, as faithful followers of Jesus Christ.

How are we to react when we hear the account of the passion and death of the Lord? Paul tells us that our attitude must be Christ's, who "emptied himself, taking the form of a slave." We pray that we may absorb the attitude of Christ, and face life squarely in its triumph and its pain. © Copyright, J. S. Paluch Co.
