**About the Cover**

– Pictured on the bulletin cover is the Holy Family, from a stained glass window in St. Patrick Church. The window depicts the Holy Family of Nazareth; the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, and Jesus as a young boy. The family is going about their tasks of daily life. Mary is working with a distaff and spindle, calling to mind the ideal wife described in Proverbs 31:19. Joseph, the carpenter, is at work providing for his family. Jesus, the obedient Son, is assisting. The three figures are of one accord and are much attuned to each other. However, the child Jesus, also seems to be listening to another – his heavenly Father's voice. He is the one who asked of his parents "Why did you search for me? Did you not know I must be about my Father's business?" Despite the harmony, there is a foreshadowing of Jesus' destiny as our crucified Savior. The blood red cloth and the cross like lumber carried by the young boy are indicators of the man he will become that laid down His life for us. In 1937, former pastor, Fr. William P. Clark wrote a book entitled, "Brief History of St. Patrick's Parish." He wrote that the window, a gift of the Dwyer Brothers costing \$180, was added at the time of the addition to the church in 1910-11. Over the course of time as an outgrowth of our 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary year, we hope to feature other artistic and devotional works within the church that give us a foretaste of heaven.

### **BELIEVING**

New birth, new life, good news! These themes run throughout today's scripture readings. The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles describes the joyful early days of the newly born church when members devoted themselves to instruction, the communal life, the breaking of bread, and the prayers. The passage from Peter's first letter echoes that joy, and assures those who now believe though they never saw Jesus that their faith will lead to their salvation. But amid all the joy, the Gospel reading calls us to sober reality. Not everyone can believe so easily. Even an apostle can doubt this astonishing news of the Resurrection. Across the centuries, Jesus reaches forward to touch us today: "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."
