About the Cover

– Pictured on the bulletin cover is the restored oil painting of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Child. Dates are a bit inexact but this painting hung over the side altar in 1866 to the mid-1880's when it was replaced by the statue of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This painting and its companion painting of St. Joseph and Child were then stored for about 120 years in the church basement. Dirt, tears, and the ravages of time have been repaired. They once again enliven our devotion to Our Lady, St. Joseph, and the Christ Child. In the lower left hand corner of each painting the artist wrote "Alcan fecit." Latin for "Alcan made this." Our painting of the Blessed Virgin Mary is based on an ancient icon attributed to St. Luke the Evangelist. Arriving in Rome in 390 AD, it is in the Basilica of St. Mary Major in Rome titled "Salus Populi Romani" (Protectress of the Roman People). Over the course of time, as an outgrowth of our 150th anniversary year, we hope to feature other sacred, artistic, and devotional works within the church that give us a foretaste of heaven.

ST. PATRICK CHURCH NEWS

New Organ Project Is Underway – I am pleased to announce that after years of talk, deliberation, and fervent prayers, a new organ will make its home at St. Patrick this summer. Late last year, we contracted with the Muller Pipe Organ Company of Croton, Ohio, to refurbish an organ originally housed in a church in Syracuse, NY. The church had closed, and the building had sold, and with help from the Muller Company, we purchased the organ. Their work to restore the organ for us soon began. The organ is an Austin model and has 16 ranks (sets of pipes).

Later this month, our existing organ will be disassembled and removed from the church to make way for the new instrument. As of now, the schedule calls for the installation of the new organ to be completed by the end of August. Weekend Masses will be celebrated at regularly scheduled times during this period; however, there will be some disruption to the daily Mass schedule, so please watch the bulletin for details.

This organ will serve parishioners of St. Patrick for generations to come. An investment like this would not be possible without generous donors and benefactors, and thanks to them, a portion of the funding for this project has already been secured. It is my hope to secure additional funding in the coming weeks and months. The total cost of the project is \$156,200.00.

Your prayers for the safety of all of the workers, and the successful completion of this project, will greatly be appreciated.

GIVING OF ONESELF

Scientists have recently begun to discuss the idea that the primary force behind all life in the universe is self-gift. This is how everything from galaxies to human babies are born and sustained.

If we read the opening of today's passage from Isaiah correctly, we see that he anticipated twentieth-century scientists by over twenty five hundred years. Using the self-giving example of the rain and snow clouds that water the earth that then yields fruit, which in turn is given over to nourish creatures, Isaiah leads us to understand that the primary force behind all life is the word of God. The ultimate giving of that word, we believe, was Jesus Christ, who, in the greatest revelation of divine love, gave of himself on the cross.

To what degree are we in touch with that self-giving God in whose image we are made? To what extent do we really follow the self-giving example of Christ into whose death and resurrection we were baptized, whose ultimate self-gift we celebrate every week in the Eucharist? With God's help, our lives can be like Isaiah's rain and snow, and we will not return to heaven until we have done our part to make the earth fruitful.
