About the Cover – Pictured on the bulletin cover is the restored oil painting of St. Joseph with the Christ Child. Like its companion painting, Our Lady, Protectress of the Roman People, it once hung over a side altar from 1866 until the mid-1880's when it was replaced by the St. Joseph statue that we know today. These two paintings were restored by David Terry Fine Arts in Columbus. The frames, provided by the Fr. Reidy Council of the Knights of Columbus, London, are from Archive Gallery in German Village. A special thanks goes to Jim and Monica Price who did much of the leg and research work for the project. St. Joseph, as foster father of Jesus, is shown holding the Christ Child which is expected. What is unexpected is that St. Joseph's staff is in flower. According to the 145 AD apocryphal "Protoevangelium of James", the Blessed Virgin Mary, had many suitors when she came of marriageable age. The choice was confirmed when out of all the walking sticks of the men it was only St. Joseph's that broke out into bloom. Over the course of time, as an outgrowth of our 150th anniversary year, we hope to feature other sacred, artistic, and devotional works within the church that give us a foretaste of heaven.

PRAYER

The "foreigners" as Isaiah calls them, the "Gentiles" as Paul calls them, or the "Canaanites" as Matthew calls them are all invited to worship the one true God in prayer. At times, we may be tempted to ask, "Why pray?" The question is rhetorical; it is tantamount to asking why friends should talk to one another or why people in love should embrace one another. Prayer is a way of relating to God, a way of talking to God. The apostles had the opportunity to talk directly to Jesus. Our opportunity to talk to Jesus is through prayer. John Donne, a fifteenth-century poet, knew about the qualities of good prayer. The poet did not want God merely to "knock, breathe, shine, and seek to mend," but rather to "break, blow, burn, and make [him] new."

It takes a dynamic faith on our part to come to God in prayer. Jesus told the woman in today's Gospel that because of her great faith, her daughter was healed. If we are as persistent as that woman, who knows what results may follow?
