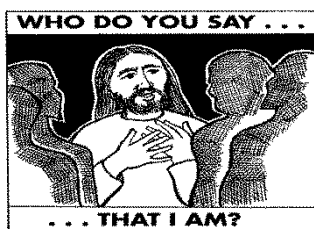

**About the Cover** – Pictured on the bulletin cover is the restored oil painting of St. Joseph with the Christ Child. Like its companion painting, Our Lady, Protectress of the Roman People, it once hung over a side altar from 1866 until the mid-1880's when it was replaced by the St. Joseph statue that we know today. These two paintings were restored by David Terry Fine Arts in Columbus. The frames, provided by the Fr. Reidy Council of the Knights of Columbus, London, are from Archive Gallery in German Village. A special thanks goes to Jim and Monica Price who did much of the leg and research work for the project. St. Joseph, as foster father of Jesus, is shown holding the Christ Child which is expected. What is unexpected is that St. Joseph's staff is in flower. According to the 145 AD apocryphal "Protoevangelium of James", the Blessed Virgin Mary, had many suitors when she came of marriageable age. The choice was confirmed when out of all the walking sticks of the men it was only St. Joseph's that broke out into bloom. Over the course of time, as an outgrowth of our 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary year, we hope to feature other sacred, artistic, and devotional works within the church that give us a foretaste of heaven.

## THE ROCK

Peter was Jesus' choice to lead the fragile band of Apostles. In today's Gospel, Simon is given a new name—Peter, the "rock." In John's Gospel, Peter is called to be a shepherd. He is expected to lay down his life for his sheep. And tradition tells us that he did just that. But today we think about the durable rocklike quality that Jesus needed in a leader.

Peter was appointed to his leadership position for reasons we are not able to fathom. God knows, and Jesus knew well, that Peter was flawed. We cannot mistake his enthusiasms, though, his manifest love, and his great, exuberant faith. Those virtues saw him through. They are durable, tough, beautiful virtues. They make Peter a sympathetic and lovable person. They provide us with the balance and humor that we need as we consider our own roles in the universal church.
