Special Collection – Hurricane Irma Relief –October 28/29

Next week, there will be a Special Collection for the relief efforts now underway for the devastation of Hurricane Irma that left our brothers and sisters in the Caribbean, especially the Diocese of St. Thomas in the Virgin Islands and the southern United States in need of help. There will be Disaster Relief envelopes in the pews for this Collection. Your generosity is much appreciated.

About the Cover

– Pictured on the bulletin cover is the stained glass window in St. Patrick's Church depicting the parable of the Good Samaritan. The window shows the story as found in Luke's gospel (10: 25-37) where a Jew was robbed and left for dead along a busy road. A temple priest and a Levite saw and should have helped him but chose to ignore him and passed by. However, a Samaritan (a people generally at odds with the Jews) took pity on him and saw to his immediate and long term care. The Samaritan is imaged as the Lord Jesus – his robes and the style of halo are strong hints that this is Christ.

But look carefully at the faces of the two. Aren't they the same face? There's a whole sermon going on here in stained glass! There's Jesus who brings healing to those in need and there's also Jesus who is in need of healing. Read the gospel from Matthew (25: 31-46) to help understand what is meant.

Former pastor, Fr. William P. Clark wrote a book, "Brief History of St. Patrick's Parish" in 1937. He wrote that the window, a gift of Mr. and Mrs. Michael McNamara costing \$180, was added at the time of the addition to the church in 1910-11.

EVERYTHING BELONGS TO GOD

The first reading from the prophet Isaiah concerns the Persian King Cyrus, called the Lord's "anointed." Cyrus deserves this title because he ended the Babylonian captivity of the Jews. However, Isaiah reminds us that it was God who gave Cyrus his power. He may be a great king, but "I am the LORD and there is no other," says God (Isaiah 45:5). Today's Gospel is also concerned with worldly power. In the passage from Matthew, the Pharisees try to trick Jesus into speaking against the emperor. His famous answer is the perfect reply. Like the kings of old, Caesar can be given the respect due his position, but everything belongs to God. In the second reading, Paul gives thanks for all who are faithful to Jesus Christ and his gospel. He, too, reminds us that our call and the power to be faithful come from God. © Copyright, J. S.
