Second Collection – Diocese of Mandeville - Jamaica

This weekend, there will be a Second Collection for the Diocese of Mandeville in Jamaica. Funds donated will help provide the most basic of needs such as food and clothing, educating their young, house orphans and the destitute elderly in a dignified way and also provide medical care.

About the Cover – Pictured on the bulletin cover is the stained glass window in St. Patrick's Church depicting the parable of the Good Samaritan. The window shows the story as found in Luke's gospel (10: 25-37) where a Jew was robbed and left for dead along a busy road. A temple priest and a Levite saw and should have helped him but chose to ignore him and passed by. However, a Samaritan (a people generally at odds with the Jews) took pity on him and saw to his immediate and long term care. The Samaritan is imaged as the Lord Jesus – his robes and the style of halo are strong hints that this is Christ. But look carefully at the faces of the two. Aren't they the same face? There's a whole sermon going on here in stained glass! There's Jesus who brings healing to those in need and there's also Jesus who is in need of healing. Read the gospel from Matthew (25: 31-46) to help understand what is meant. Former pastor, Fr. William P. Clark wrote a book, "Brief History of St. Patrick's Parish" in 1937. He wrote that the window, a gift of Mr. and Mrs. Michael McNamara costing \$180, was added at the time of the addition to the church in 1910-11.

GOD IS IN CHARGE

"Who do you think you are?!" today's readings demand. We are called up short, put in our place, given a dose of reality. Who is God? Who is in charge? Who is the greatest? We begin a passage from the prophet Malachi, one of the latest prophets, who wrote after the Jews returned from Babylon. Calling people to task in God's name, he condemns the divisions and false teachings that have cropped up, reminding them that all were created by the one God. Paul tells the Thessalonians the same thing, but in a positive way—praising them for remembering that it is God who is at work within them. Finally, the Gospel presents Jesus speaking out against hypocrisy and vainglory. "You have but one teacher... you have but one Father" (Matthew 23:8, 9). We are firmly put in our place.
