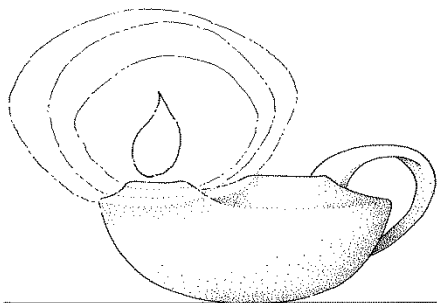

**About the Cover**

– Pictured on the bulletin cover is the stained glass window in St. Patrick’s Church depicting the parable of the Good Samaritan. The window shows the story as found in Luke’s gospel (10: 25-37) where a Jew was robbed and left for dead along a busy road. A temple priest and a Levite saw and should have helped him but chose to ignore him and passed by. However, a Samaritan (a people generally at odds with the Jews) took pity on him and saw to his immediate and long term care. The Samaritan is imaged as the Lord Jesus – his robes and the style of halo are strong hints that this is Christ.

But look carefully at the faces of the two. Aren’t they the same face? There’s a whole sermon going on here in stained glass! There’s Jesus who brings healing to those in need and there’s also Jesus who is in need of healing. Read the gospel from Matthew (25: 31-46) to help understand what is meant.

Former pastor, Fr. William P. Clark wrote a book, “Brief History of St. Patrick’s Parish” in 1937. He wrote that the window, a gift of Mr. and Mrs. Michael McNamara costing \$180, was added at the time of the addition to the church in 1910-11.

## ST. PATRICK SCHOOL NEWS

**St. Patrick School Receives Grant** – We are delighted to announce that St. Patrick School has received a \$4,000 grant from the Catholic Foundation. The grant funds are to be used to replace the existing four-foot fluorescent light lamps in the entire school with LED lamps. There is a two-fold benefit to this conversion. Enhanced lighting is a direct result with a significant reduction in operational costs, as well. It is anticipated that the new LED lamps will reduce energy consumption by up to 73%. When fully implemented, we expect an annual cost reduction in electric energy of nearly \$7,000. We are grateful to Erin Morris, Parish Business Manager, who wrote our grant application and to the Catholic Foundation and its many generous donors who made funding our project possible.
