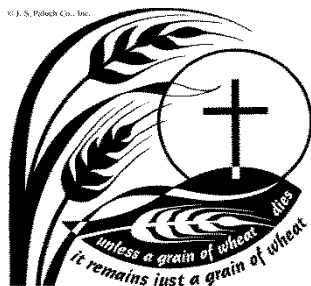

About the Cover – Pictured on the bulletin cover is the twelfth of the fourteen Stations of the Cross in St. Patrick Church. *“We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world”* is a familiar refrain for those who pray this devotion especially during the season of Lent. The origins of this devotion can be found in the many people who desired to visit and walk the very places where Jesus trod but were unable to do so. The stations are based on specific events and locations on the Via Dolorosa (Way of Sorrows) in Jerusalem and give us an opportunity to reflect on Christ’s great sacrifice of love for us. A simple cross is all that is necessary to mark a station but paintings and statuary generally accompany each cross to help visualize the depicted event. For us, the original stations were oil paintings painted by Prof. Alcon of Paris, the same artist who painted the restored oils of Jesus with Mary and St. Joseph in the sanctuary. These stational paintings, long gone, were replaced in 1910 by the stations we know today. These “new ones” each had at one time a large cross, the same size and design as the XII station, but without the Corpus. Donors were the Singletons, Maddens, Buckleys, McCulloughs, Devereaux, Lanigans, Higgins, Foodys, Morrisseys, Barretts, and Fr. McNamara – names still familiar to our community.
