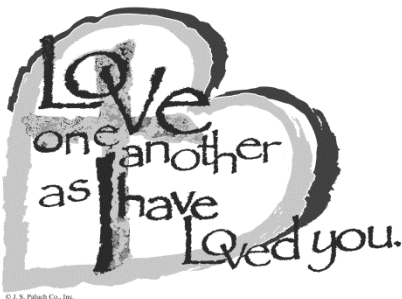

**About the Cover** – Pictured on the bulletin cover is the crucifix on the Altar of Repose above the tabernacle. Different crucifixes have been used at different times over the years. One of a simpler design continues to be used during Lent. Another one in the “Upper Room Museum” is a marble crucifix that can be seen in early photographs of the church. This particular one on the cover was given to St. Patrick’s by Mike Koesters, who is frequently a psalmist/cantor, especially at the 7:30 a.m. Sunday Mass. Mike tells that it was passed on to him by family members and that it was originally from the Cathedral of the Diocese of Nashville. It is of Gothic design most likely from the late 19<sup>th</sup> century to the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. Its Gothic design complements the altar appointments of our 19<sup>th</sup> century church.

A hymn for Good Friday from *The Roman Missal* describes the cross in this way:

“Faithful Cross the Saints rely on,  
 Noble tree beyond compare!  
 Never was there such a scion,  
 Never leaf or flower so rare.  
 Sweet the timber, sweet the iron,  
 Sweet the burden that they bear.”

## THE PRESENCE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

We have a unique episode in the Acts of the Apostles today. A whole roomful of people are baptized with the Holy Spirit before they are baptized with water! The verb used—"the Holy Spirit 'fell' on them" (Acts 10:44)—is characteristic of the way the Spirit works throughout the book of Acts: powerful and surprising. Though this "baptism" is not the normative way the New Testament describes baptism, it is still a good reminder today that the Holy Spirit is not controlled by whether or not we pour water, but rather that our sacramental signs reveal the presence of the Spirit at work among us. And we have a double reinforcement of how this work is accomplished from a Letter and a Gospel bearing John's name. It is love, self-sacrificing and self-giving love, that manifests the Spirit of Jesus in our midst. It is love that is the greatest of commandments. The Spirit is manifested equally through those who live in that love.
