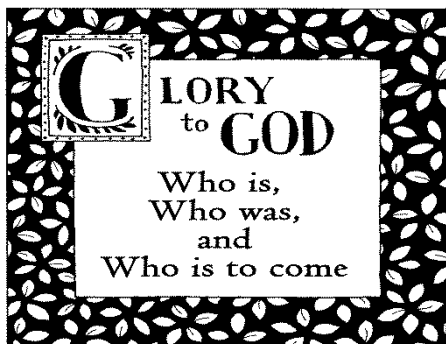

About the Cover – Pictured on the bulletin cover is the crucifix on the Altar of Repose above the tabernacle. Different crucifixes have been used at different times over the years. One of a simpler design continues to be used during Lent. Another one in the “Upper Room Museum” is a marble crucifix that can be seen in early photographs of the church. This particular one on the cover was given to St. Patrick’s by Mike Koesters, who is frequently a psalmist/cantor, especially at the 7:30 a.m. Sunday Mass. Mike tells that it was passed on to him by family members and that it was originally from the Cathedral of the Diocese of Nashville. It is of Gothic design most likely from the late 19th century to the early 20th century. Its Gothic design complements the altar appointments of our 19th century church.

A hymn for Good Friday from *The Roman Missal* describes the cross in this way:

“Faithful Cross the Saints rely on,
 Noble tree beyond compare!
 Never was there such a scion,
 Never leaf or flower so rare.
 Sweet the timber, sweet the iron,
 Sweet the burden that they bear.”

THE MYSTERY OF THE BLESSED TRINITY

Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Church sets aside this Sunday to focus our attention on the mystery of the Blessed Trinity, God who is one, but three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The first reading from Deuteronomy emphasizes both God's awesome greatness and amazing nearness. It might seem beyond belief, but the God of all creation speaks to us, protects us, and guides us. The second reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans describes how we are to relate to the three persons who are one God. We are led by the Spirit to meet God the Father as adopted children. Our adoption is such that we are even heirs with our brother, Christ, the second person of the Trinity, in whose sufferings we must also share. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus speaks with his authority as God and sends us to teach and baptize in the name of the Trinity.
