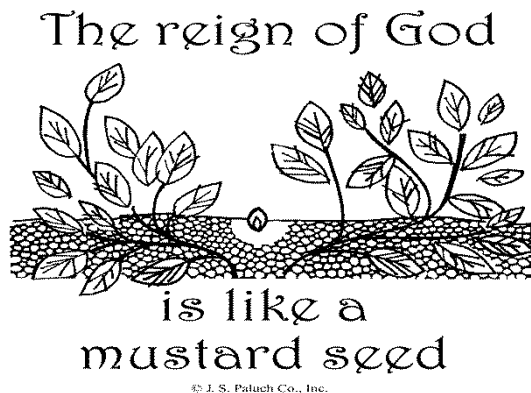

About the Cover – Pictured on the bulletin cover is our parish's statue of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus whose Solemnity was celebrated on Friday, June 8th this year. "One of the most beloved aspects of our Catholic tradition is our devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In honoring the Sacred Heart, we are honoring the compassion and love of Christ: his human heart, moved with pity for his flock, his divine heart, pierced for the sins of his people. From the heart of Christ, pierced by the soldier's lance, blood and water poured out, 'the well-spring of the Church's sacraments.'"

"The statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus was blessed in the church April 23, 1885 and is the gift of twelve persons everyone contributing \$10. The cost of the statue was \$120, with the following donors: Rev. W. D. Hickey, John Conway, James Dwyer, Foley Bros., Daniel Mulcahy, Richard Peard, Enos Purcell, Mrs. Michael Riley, John Reardon, John Stahl, Henry Walker, Mrs. Jacob Weber." Missionary Weekend – Fr. Mathew Kaniyamparambil will be representing The Pontifical Institute for Foreign Missions (PIME) during the June 30 – July 1 weekend. He is currently a missionary at PIME's mission in the Yaounde Diocese in Cameroon, Africa. PIME is a Catholic missionary institute of priests and brothers who commit themselves to lifelong missionary service. They are actively involved in human development and the promotion of justice, peace and the promotion of interreligious dialogue. Their ministries include the establishment of schools, hospitals, orphanages, and founding new Catholic communities and providing their pastoral care. A collection will be taken that will serve the missionaries and their world travels as they announce the Gospel to non-Christian peoples.

SOS Collection – The Knights of Columbus collected a total of \$283.10 last weekend through the "Support Our Seminarians" loose change collection. The money collected will be used for the needs of the seminary students in the Columbus Diocese. The next SOS Collection will be August 25/26. Thank you for your generosity.

GOD'S TIME

We either pay attention to or ignore "clock time" as we play in the summer sun and note the earth's tilt and the lengthening days. We live by time. We reckon time in seconds and minutes and hours, or we use broader chunks like supertime and summertime.

God keeps another sort of time. God speaks to us of "saving time," that is, the time of salvation. This sense of time is called *kairos*, and this time is always now, always present and available, always revealing, often surprising.

This Sunday's readings alert us to the reality and the import of God's time. Ezekiel and the Gospel of Mark remind us that our labor and our plotting and our planning rest in God. For God takes our smallest efforts and makes of them great works. Paul points us to the "harvest" time, urges us to be watchful for its coming, and calls us to recognize that we must spend our time pleasing God. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.
