

**About the Cover** – Pictured on the bulletin cover is our parish's statue of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus whose Solemnity was celebrated on June 8 this year. "One of the most beloved aspects of our Catholic tradition is our devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In honoring the Sacred Heart, we are honoring the compassion and love of Christ: his human heart, moved with pity for his flock, his divine heart, pierced for the sins of his people. From the heart of Christ, pierced by the soldier's lance, blood and water poured out, 'the well-spring of the Church's sacraments.'"

"The statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus was blessed in the church April 23, 1885 and is the gift of twelve persons everyone contributing \$10. The cost of the statue was \$120, with the following donors: Rev. W. D. Hickey, John Conway, James Dwyer, Foley Bros., Daniel Mulcahy, Richard Peard, Enos Purcell, Mrs. Michael Riley, John Reardon, John Stahl, Henry Walker, Mrs. Jacob Weber." **PIME Missionary Weekend** – Fr. Mathew Kaniyamparambil will be representing The Pontifical Institute for Foreign Missions (PIME) during the June 30 – July 1 weekend. He is currently a missionary at PIME's mission in the Yaounde Diocese in Cameroon, Africa. PIME is a Catholic missionary institute of priests and brothers who commit themselves to lifelong missionary service. They are actively involved in human development and the promotion of justice, peace and the promotion of interreligious dialogue. Their ministries include the establishment of schools, hospitals, orphanages, and founding new Catholic communities and providing their pastoral care. A collection will be taken that will serve the missionaries and their world travels as they announce the Gospel to non-Christian peoples.
