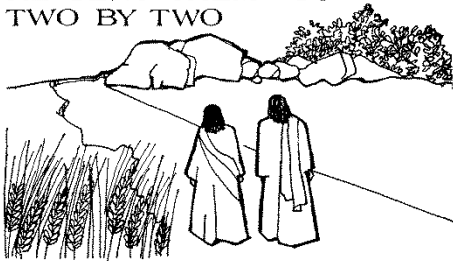

St. Patrick Early Learning Center is now enrolling for the 2018-2019 school year. Our preschool program was established in 2002 to provide quality care for children ages 2 ½ - 5 years old. The ELC is licensed by the Ohio Department of Education and is a part of St. Patrick School. The ELC has two programs available to parents – full-time and part-time. Our programs are guided by the Early Learning Content Standards set by the Ohio Department of Education. The program director holds a Master's diploma in Early Childhood Development. BI-MONTHLY MASS OF HEALING JULY 16, 6:30 PM, ST. JOSEPH CATHEDRAL, 212 E. Broad St. in Columbus on the Memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Following the Mass, the Healing Service will begin with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Veneration of relics of the True Cross. Each person will then have an opportunity to speak individually with one of several priests present to discuss their particular situation and receive a prayer of healing; the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will also be available. The Healing Service will conclude with Benediction. All persons who seek Christ's healing are invited – especially those who suffer with physical illness and infirmities (e.g. cancer and other debilitating diseases and conditions), in addition to those in seek emotional and spiritual healing. All caregivers, family members, and members of the medical community are invited as well. Bi-monthly Healing Masses take place at the Cathedral on the third Monday of the month. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Does the scene of the disciples being sent out two by two bring to mind any other scripture? After the flood, Noah opens the door of the ark and sends his passengers out to renew the face of the earth. Certainly, Jesus has the same purpose. The purpose is fulfilled in your communion in the Body of Christ today, and in your being sent from the Eucharist into the world. The sending is so important that our word "Mass" derives from it. In Latin, the last words of worship are *Ite, missa est*, which means "Go, you are sent." From that, people began to call Catholic worship the *missa*, or in English, the "Mass." Our English words dismissal, missal, emissary, and mission are all related. We are not sent into the workaday world alone, but in relationship to one another. Some people have acquired the unhappy habit of leaving worship as soon as they receive Communion and therefore miss the prayer, the dismissal, and the solemn blessing that are essential parts of the Mass. The dismissal is a seal on our Communion and reveals its purpose. Thanks be to God!
