

Second Collection: August 4/5 – Church in Latin America
 For many in Latin America and Caribbean, rural terrain and a
 lack of ministers are obstacles to practicing their faith. Your
 support to the collection provides lay leadership training,
 catechesis, priestly and religious formation, as well as other
 programs to help share our faith with those who long to hear
 the Good News of Christ.

About the Cover – Pictured on the bulletin cover is the
 exterior of the Reconciliation Room here in St. Patrick
 Church. Originally, in the transepts of the church, there were
 two confessionals as they were (and still are) called in which
 the Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated. This
 sacrament is also called Penance and Confession. Today's
 Reconciliation Room incorporates one of the two original
 confessionals. Sometime during the 1990s, the confessional
 on St. Joseph's side of the church was dismantled for
 storage leaving the one on Blessed Virgin Mary's side in
 use. During the 2004 renovations, the remaining
 confessional was used in the construction of the
 Reconciliation Room in which the sacrament may be
 celebrated face to face with the priest or if the penitent
 prefers behind a screen to preserve anonymity.
 The two older confessionals dated from 1911. The wood
 from the dismantled confessional was used to construct the
 St. John the Evangelist Shrine and the reredos (backdrop) of
 the baptistery. This confessional was a gift from Mr. and
 Mrs. George Killeen costing \$150. The confessional that
 found its way into the Reconciliation Room was a gift from
 Mrs. Mary White and her daughter, Mrs. M Sullivan.

Over the course of time as an outgrowth of our 150th
 anniversary year in 2016, we hope to feature other artistic
 and devotional works within the church that give us a
 foretaste of heaven.

THE BREAD OF LIFE

Today's Gospel has the crowd asking Jesus three questions. First, "When did you get here," to which Jesus responds by rebuking them for their failure to grasp his miracle as a "sign," an occasion to put faith in him. Their second question about accomplishing the "works of God" has Jesus respond that faith is the "work" that God wishes. Many scholars believe this is John's answer to the faith-works dichotomy emerging in the early Christian community. Faith is the work of God in the believer, John would have us understand. The third question asked by the crowd is a request for a "sign" that would allow them to put faith in Jesus, as the manna in the desert allowed the Israelites to put faith in the Lord God.
