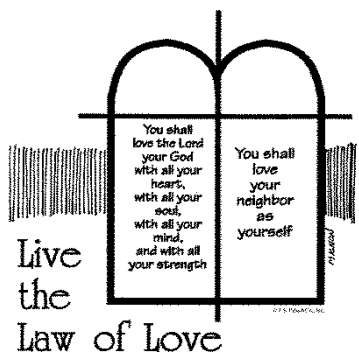

A Message From Fr. Hinterschied

Merit is an act upon which God bestows a reward, ultimately leading to eternal life in Heaven. Just as generations have done so before us, we aid those who have preceded us in faith by offering our merits to God on their behalf. Do you aid the Holy Souls? They cannot help themselves – they need our assistance. As we commemorate All Souls in November, I ask you to consider three things:

1. Pray and make sacrifices for the dead, especially by visiting a cemetery.
2. Enroll your intentions for Masses.
3. Please pray for and support vocations, so that we-formed, faithful priests will continue to offer the Mass for the Poor Souls.

The souls in Purgatory can be helped by praying, fasting, almsgiving, and offering up the many crosses of our daily lives for them; especially by taking advantage of the indulgences offered by the Church. We can earn a Plenary Indulgence on each of the first eight days of November (under the usual conditions) for a soul in Purgatory by visiting a cemetery and devoutly praying for the faithful departed. Under her title of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, Our Lady is often depicted in sacred art dispensing graces upon the Holy Souls in Purgatory, as part of her Brown Scapular promises. Mary revealed to St. Bridget of Sweden, "I am the mother of all the souls in Purgatory; and all the sufferings which they deserve for the sins committed in life are every hour, while they remain there, alleviated in some measure by my prayers." Offer your prayers on behalf of the Holy Souls to Our Lady. Christ's Sacrifice upon the Cross is of infinite merit, thus the most efficacious way of assisting souls in Purgatory is to have the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered for them – the re-presentation of Calvary.

Church And Parish Center Repair - The parish has contracted with Quality Masonry to perform needed repairs to the church and parish center buildings. The work is just getting underway, and will include stucco and concrete repair, window trim and cupola painting, replacement of the wall around the handicapped ramp, repair of the ceiling above the choir loft, and parish center spot tuck-pointing and exterior painting. The total project cost is \$80,980, with rebates from the Bishop's Annual Appeal anticipated to fund most of the expense. Please watch for any restricted areas around the buildings while the work takes place. We appreciate your patience.
