

About the Cover – The image on the bulletin cover is another familiar image of the Blessed Virgin Mary – The Immaculate Heart of Mary to be exact! In 1885, statues replaced the paintings on the side altars. Those paintings were restored in 2017 and now hang in the front of church near the side altars. The current statue of Our Lady is not the original one but a replacement donated by Miss Margaret Murray for \$54. The two side altars themselves were both gifts of Mrs. James (Mary) Ryan for \$600. It appears from records that these were gifts from around 1912 when the church was extended and remodeled. As an aside, in the connecting hall between the church and the parish center, there are some photographs from around 1920. One of the photographs shows Mary's altar with an ornate reredos (background). The reredos included two relief carvings – one of the Annunciation and the other of the Visitation. This background was removed apparently in the 1940s. Anybody know what happened to them? Over the course of time as an outgrowth of our 2016's 150th anniversary year, we hope to feature other artistic and devotional works within the church that give us a foretaste of heaven.

A Message From Fr. Hinterschied

Consider these five spiritual things to thank God for:

1. *His Providence* – God provided for us so that we might have no major wants. Above all, our spiritual needs as He supports us in all our daily efforts and directs us to our proper end.
2. *Sublime Things* – The things of transcendent excellence that cause our souls to be awed: works of art, music, liturgy, scenes of nature, and heroic feats. Sublime things reflect Him. They do not happen all the time, but oftentimes when we most needed them.
3. *Special People* – in our insufficiency, they allowed us to see that we are not alone in the battle. There are so many blessings found in the Catholic family that bind us together. There are also those less able and fortunate that God puts in our path so that we might practice charity and patience.
4. *Crosses* – yes, we need to thank God for all that He has sent us. The greatest cross is living in a world that does not acknowledge God as King. We believe these sufferings are given for our good. By accepting the Way of the Cross, we can imitate Christ, who took His mission to its final consequences. We can be comforted by the fact that the Cross's self-denial gives value, meaning, and beauty to all things.
5. *His Mother* – Finally without this great gift, everything would be impossible. Amidst setbacks and defeat, she rallies to our assistance. We need only to be among those who have "fled to her protection, implored her help and sought her intercession." She leaves no one "unaided." She is the means by which all can be accomplished, and victory obtained, as promised at Fatima.

Even in these violent and difficult times, we are truly blessed. May we make this Thanksgiving different and thank God for the spiritual things for which so few thank Him.
