About the Cover – Pictured on the bulletin cover is the church bell. The March 24, 1870 issue of the “The Catholic Telegraph” reported “The 17th was a memorable day for London. Apart from the celebration of the festival of Ireland’s great Apostle, St. Patrick, always of interest to the true Catholic, no matter where born, but of deep religious and national significance to the exiled children of the Green Isle, the blessing of a new bell lent an attracting and interesting feature to the occasion. At the conclusion of a Solemn High Mass,...the Rt. Rev. Bishop Rosecrans, of Columbus,...pronounc(ed) the benediction of the bell.” A portion of the rite of blessing reads “Whenever it rings, may the spirit of evil depart, may the Christian people practice their faith, may Satan’s power over them be stricken, and may they be strengthened in the Lord as they worship together.” For almost 150 years, this 1,813 lb. bell has called the people of London to prayer, rang out joyful news, and mournfully tolled for those who have died. The bell is engraved on one side with the words “Buckeye Bell Foundry 1870” and on the opposite side “VanDuzen Cincinnati Ohio”. The Verdin Company (which acquired the Buckeye and VanDuzen companies over the years and currently maintains our bell system) reports that just our bell alone would be valued today at \$30,000. Over the course of time as an outgrowth of our 2016’s 150th anniversary, we hope to feature other artistic and devotional works within the church that give a foretaste of heaven.

A Message From Fr. Hinterschied

From a material perspective, life in America gets better and better. From a moral perspective, we cannot make the same claim.

The Church's public witness has been badly damaged and is likely to suffer further damage. The revelation of scandals this past summer will certainly affect the credibility of the Church to speak on any moral matter. The likely result is more attempts to push the Church out of the public square and to diminish its influence.

According to Professor Scott Hahn, the current crisis in the Church is worse than the crisis precipitated by the Reformation. Others have described it in even more apocalyptic terms. Cardinal Raymond Burke has characterized it as "possibly the worst crisis that it's [the Church] ever experienced." "Our Lady warned us at Fatima about an apostasy from the faith," said Burke. "I believe there's been a practical apostasy from the faith with regard to all questions involving human sexuality..."

The long-awaited summit on clerical sex abuse to be held at the Vatican is from February 21-24. It's highly unlikely that the kind of reforms that are needed can be discussed and formulated in a few days.

There are other reasons to be concerned. The summit is being called "The Protection of Minors in the Church." Yet the present crisis is not mainly about the abuse of minors. It's about the abuse of seminarians by priests and bishops, consensual sex among priests, and the coverup of such misconduct by bishops and cardinals. Is there an attempt to avoid the root problems — one of which is the existence of a homosexual subculture?

The gravity of the scandals needs to be met with an equally grave response. Since the Church is not a mere institution, but a divine one with a spiritual, and not a temporal, end, the only way that structural reform can succeed is if it is preceded by genuine spiritual reform: the spirit gives meaning and *gravitas* to the structures. It is never the other way around.
