**About the Cover**

– Pictured on the bulletin cover is our venerable statue of St. Patrick, patron of our parish. Usually observed on March 17, his day would generally be ranked as a solemnity for our parish but this year it gives way to the Lord's Day, the Second Sunday of Lent. Not to worry, we'll celebrate our beloved St. Patrick – stay tuned for details. St. Patrick, who died in 461, was born in Britain but was taken to Ireland where he was sold into slavery at the age of 16. After escaping, he became a priest and eventually a bishop. He is credited with evangelizing both Britain and Ireland. Returning to the land of his slavery was a great challenge to Patrick, who persevered. Patrick is now the patron saint of Ireland along with St. Bridget, and St. Columba. This statue of St. Patrick, costing \$62, was a gift to the parish from former pastor, Fr. Abraham McNamara around 1916. Life size and realistic in depiction, this statue has aged with the years. Earlier photographs show St. Patrick had quite the dark beard and hair at one time but after a century who wouldn't be gray. The statue shows St. Patrick vested as an archbishop, with the pallium of a metropolitan archbishop, the miter and crosier of a bishop, the chasuble of a priest, and the dalmatic of a deacon – the fullness of orders that is a bishop. Not to be forgotten, St. Patrick holds out a shamrock with its three leaves to remind us of the three divine persons of the Blessed Trinity. Over the course of time as an outgrowth of our 2016's 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary year, we hope to feature other artistic and devotional works within the church that give us a foretaste of heaven.



**Stations of the Cross** will be held in the church every Friday at 7:00 p.m. during Lent except on Good Friday.

**A Message From Fr. Hinterschied**

St. Luke tells us this Sunday that Our Lord "was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days," (4:1) and in the Acts of the Apostles we read that following 40 days after His Resurrection and after the day of His Ascension, Our Lady and the Apostles gathered "together in one place" and "devoted themselves to prayer" (2:1; 1:14) awaiting the arrival of the Holy Spirit.

The *Catechism* teaches the same Spirit who teaches the Church and recalls everything that Jesus said, also forms her in the life of prayer; and that there are different forms of prayer: "blessing and adoration", "petition", "intercession", "thanksgiving", and "praise" (CCC 2623-2640).

Adoration is fundamental, for by it we acknowledge we are not our own creator and that Almighty God is indeed awesome for He has both made us and redeemed us through Christ. Adoration is defined by respectful silence.

In continuing to discuss the liturgy, in lead-up to our Traditional Latin Mass in celebration of our beloved Patrick, silence is glaringly more apparent in this form of the Mass. Everything up to and including the Creed is sung or spoken out loud, whereas once the Offertory and the Canon (aka "Eucharistic Prayer") are reached, a decisive shift is made to silence, to contemplation of the voiceless and eternal source of Scripture and the Creed. The simple and profound Elevation of the Host and Chalice reminds us that words could never express about the offering of Christ on the cross out of love for sinners.
