## ST. PATRICK PARISH NEWS

### A Message From Fr. Hinterschied

In 1972 President Nixon enthusiastically called his visit to the People's Republic of China, "The week that changed the world."

In today's Holy Mass is St. Luke's account of the Passion, two criminals, likely revolutionaries (Lk 23:33), are crucified with Our Lord and one reviles Him: "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us," (Lk 23:39). Yet this is precisely what Jesus is doing—sacrificing Himself and thus saving us.

In his encyclical *Veritatis Splendor*, Pope St. John Paul II asserts that the Cross reveals authentic freedom.

Mao's Cultural Revolution of the 60's and 70's is no match for the revolution of redemption. But just as Dismas asks to be remembered by Jesus as He comes into His Kingdom, we must remember that it is the Lord's mercy we seek, not our own self-justification. And the truth is, we must convert.

"In your light we see light itself," the Psalmist says (Ps 36:10). The Easter light of the Resurrection is coming, but before it arrives, there is the light that comes from an interior revolution in which we give up sin and live again freedom in the truth (*Veritatis Splendor*, 87).

If asceticism has been forgotten, the interior revolution is impossible. It begins with the Cross. Otherwise, how could He have told us to deny ourselves, pick up our own crosses and follow Him? (Luke 9:23) The means necessary to affect an interior revolution are there, but do we have the will to use them?

Life passes right through Calvary. That revolution is permanent; it is never cheap. That is owing to the one, true revolutionary we have ever had—Our Crucified Lord!

May this Holiest Week of the year, because it is indeed the greatest, be one of grace for you and your family.

### THE EASTER TRIDUUM

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum – from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are:

Mass of the Lord's Supper  
Good Friday of the Lord's Passion  
Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord

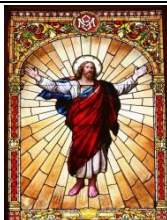
**Lenten Food Drive** has now been completed. Thanks to all who made food donations for the Madison County Food Pantry during the Lenten Food Drive.

## THE ATTITUDE OF CHRIST JESUS

The Lenten cycle brings us to this “mixed” Sunday of palm branches and painful suffering. Our liturgy opens by recalling Jesus' triumphant entry along the main road into Jerusalem, then moves quickly to the back streets of betrayal and humiliation, the courtyards of torture and abandonment, the hill of execution.

Isaiah's strange and gripping “Song of the Servant of God” was to become the song of Jesus. It is the song of one who strides forward consistently in the face of criticism, even scorn: “I have not rebelled, have not turned back.” It is to become our song, as faithful followers of Jesus Christ.

How are we to react when we hear the account of the passion and death of the Lord? Paul tells us that our attitude must be Christ's, who “emptied himself, taking the form of a slave.” We pray that we may absorb the attitude of Christ, and face life squarely in its triumph and its pain. © Copyright, J.
