A Message From Fr. Hinterschied

Directly beneath the tabernacle and mensa of our altar is found "IHS" within a circle of rays. This commonly seen Christian insignia is the credit and lasting legacy of the saint whom the Church honors tomorrow. As a boy, St. Bernardine nursed the sick during a time of pestilence in Siena. During a severe illness of his own, he decided upon entering a monastery and becoming a Franciscan. He was a powerful and eloquent preacher, in fact Pope Pius II called him "a second Paul". He particularly helped foster love and reverence toward the holy Name of Jesus. He exerted a powerful influence and inaugurated a genuine reform within the Church. Upon entering a city, Bernardine had a standard carried before him upon which was the holy Name of Jesus (IHS, a Latin monogram of the Greek Iesous Christos, "IH XP" and "IC XC") encircled with twelve golden rays and surmounted by a cross. We honor the Holy Name because of the command of Christ: "Holy Father, protect them in Your Name that You have given Me" (Jn 17:11-12). And as St. Paul wrote to the Philippians: "at the name of Jesus every knee should bend of those in heaven, on earth, and under the earth (Phil 2:10). This is the reason that Catholics bow their heads at the sound of "Jesus" both inside and outside the liturgy. St. Bernardine's glowing love for the holy Name of Jesus should fill us with admiration. Keep this blessed Name on your lips, and even more so in your heart. It is a Name that always arouses love for Christ. May we strive to never use it lightly or irreverently.
