A Message From Fr. Hinterschied

As recorded in Acts, the Apostles speak boldly on behalf of God. Something that could not be done by any authority less than God Himself. In Christ, there is an entirely new way of relating to God which brings all nations into one single people, but there is a danger that we can misunderstand this new covenantal relationship and endorse a form of "anything goes" mentality. After all, if the Apostles were able to speak for God and change observances to the Law, what else can we not change in the Church? People, and especially our separated brethren, wonder if the Church can change her teaching on sexuality, or Holy Orders, or the Rite of Penance? And so on. But this is to forget the necessity of remaining united to Christ, who has been shared with us through the ministry of the Apostles and their successors. To go contrary to the teachings of the Apostles is akin to deciding tomorrow is Friday instead of Monday. We cannot make changes to the Church simply because we feel like it. The reason the Church cannot change these things (and others) is not for the sake of nostalgia, being unwelcoming, or unappreciative of individuals. The Church cares deeply for people, all people: alive, deceased, in the womb, the dying, sinners, and saints. She knows that it would be the ultimate betrayal of God if she were to deny the distinction between right and wrong. She values grace and women so much that she has proclaimed a young Jewish girl as the Queen of the Universe. But Christ chose twelve men as His Apostles, at the same time. And the Church cannot just decide to change what Christ commanded.

In all these things, it is important to remember that in the Church, where saints and sinners are found, it is God Himself in His Holy Spirit Who is guiding us and drawing us into His Love.

We can accomplish this if, after prayerful consideration, everyone gives what they can. Any amount raised over our goal will be returned to our parish to be used for Capital Improvement needs.
