A Message From Fr. Hinterschied

The type of media consumed by people today has radically shifted. The reading of books—one of the great pleasures of life—is at an all-time low among Americans; page turning has been supplanted by screen time. Canadian psychologist, best-selling author of *12 Rules for Life: An Antidote to Chaos*, and viral YouTube subject Jordan Peterson was recently interviewed at the Prager U Summit and disseminated to millions online. Dennis Prager asked Peterson to respond to a personal story: “One day, walking through Columbia University...I had an epiphany. All of a sudden, one of the verses...came to my brain: ‘Wisdom begins with fear of the Lord.’ It changed my life. There is no wisdom at Columbia, because there is no God at Columbia. That is one of the ways I knew, ‘Oh, without God, look what happens. Without God, look what happens—morally, intellectually, in terms of wisdom. My biggest reasons for my belief in God are watching what happens when people don’t.” Jordan Peterson responded by first referencing G.K. Chesterton: “‘If you cease to believe in God, you’ll start to believe in anything.’ I’ve gone through lots of Catholic cathedrals in Europe. Of course, they are stunning creations, but they’re gothic and strange. The doctrine is eerie and complex and surreal. And the biblical writings are the same. Think of a book like Revelation, for example. But I think Catholicism—that’s as sane as people can get. We need a metaphysic—a narrative metaphysic to hold us together, and it has to be predicated on something that is transcendent and absolute. And if you lose that, then you’ll fall for something else. You’ll fall for something else. Or you’ll fall for nothing, which is no better.” This was an amazing moment. While Peterson is not Catholic, he claims he is a Christian. Maybe he will convert to Catholicism one day, who knows?

West Deanery Corpus Christi Celebration at Our Lady of



Perpetual Help - Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish, 3730 Broadway, Grove City, will host the West Deanery Corpus Christi Celebration on Sunday, June 23, 2019. Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will occur between the end of the noon Mass and 2:00 p.m. when the Liturgy of the Hours will be prayed. The outdoor Procession of the Blessed Sacrament will then take place, concluding with Benediction. Everyone is then welcome to a light reception in Our Lady's Life Center. At 5:00 p.m. the final Mass of the weekend will be celebrated. All servers from West Deanery parishes are invited

to participate. They should bring their own albs or cassocks and surplices. All 2019 First Communicants and their families are also welcome to participate in the procession, and can wear their dresses or suits. This is the 22nd anniversary of the joint Corpus Christi gathering of the parishes of the West Deanery. In 1997, the pastors of the West Deanery began this special event with an emphasis on prayers for vocations and an increase in reverence for our Eucharistic Lord. Since then eight priests and five permanent deacons have been ordained in the West Deanery. Two women and two men have made solemn professions in the religious life. Currently there are two seminarians, one of whom has recently been ordained to the transitional diaconate with the hope of ordination to the priesthood next year. Three permanent diaconate candidates are in formation with projected ordination in 2020. Our parishes have regularly scheduled times of Eucharistic adoration. Our prayers have been fruitful! Let us join together in confident prayer before the Lord Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament for all of our needs.

Enthronement-Throughout the Diocese, over two thousand families and individuals have Enthroned the Sacred Heart of Jesus in their home and come to know more deeply the Heart of the Redeemer through this powerful devotion. Among the Promises given to St. Margaret Mary in the late 1670s, He said, "I will bless every place in which an image of my Heart is exposed and honored.
